RFoG Hub – Te Runanga Tea Rooms



A split level semi-formal cottage garden.



Perennials line the paths, roses and shrubs fill the mixed borders. A manicured lawn leads to steps to the lower garden with sweeping views of Rotorua.

A mixture of over 150 rhododendrons, azaleas & camelias, along with heritage apples & roses & maples. The fishpond is home to 56 very large goldfish with the doves above.




B6 Mary (Sammy) & Bill Lean, 27 Raniera Place, Springfield

D1 Murray Linton Rose Garden, Ward Avenue, Fenton Park

The Murray Linton Rose Gardens were opened in 1970 and are named after a former Mayor of Rotorua who was also a former President of the New Zealand Rose Society. The gardens contain over 1500 plants of mostly modern varieties including miniatures, climbers & standard roses.

D2 Kathy Handley, 46a Lytton Street, Glenholme

A delightful cottage garden filled with perennials, annuals and roses which line the paths & fill the perennial borders. A moderately small site this town garden follows the contour of the building. Kathy has shown how an experienced gardener can bring a small-town garden to life.





This is an older garden with wonderful bones that needed to be loved again. Megan has brought this inner-city diamond back to life with hard work. She has updated some areas & has added a pizza oven for those summer evenings. Perennial borders & mature trees border the garden with the Mangakakahi stream just behind the fence. Gradient: Flat



E2 Kuirau Park, Kuirau Street, Central

Check out the natural boiling, bubbling & steaming geothermal action throughout Kuirau Park, New Zealand's only free geothermal public park. Kuirau Park is free to visit & located within an easy walk from the city centre, just off Pukuatua & Ranolf streets. Several walkways take you through the park to see the



crater lake, mud pools, hot springs, & a free thermal foot bath, all set in a beautifully manicured setting dotted with flower beds and native flora. Gradient: Flat

E3 Klamath Falls Rose Garden, Queens Drive, Central

The Klamath Falls Rose Garden is located in the Government Gardens, Rotorua & is named for Rotorua's sister city in Oregon, USA.

A popular venue for weddings, the roses begin blooming in mid-November & continue flowering right through until June and peak over the summer months. The Klamath Falls Rose Garden is a very popular destination.

E4 Pauline & John Murray, 2 Korokai Street, Ohinemutu

Pauline and John have a strong aesthetic and considered planting. Clipped azalea hedge contains a mix of mainly white and green plantings. Their garden is filled with perfume. The front garden has raised vegetable and herb boxes. Car parking at the bottom Hospital car park (across Lake Road).
